INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM to be held on Thursday, 18 May 2017. These include ordinary resolutions (among others) relating to (i) the granting to the Directors the Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate; and (ii) the re-election of the retiring Directors.

THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be granted the Repurchase Mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase on the Stock Exchange,

or on any other stock exchange on which the Shares of the Company may be listed, Shares up to a maximum of 10 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolutions at the AGM.

THE ISSUE MANDATE

An ordinary resolution will also be proposed at the AGM that the Directors be granted the Issue Mandate to issue, allot and deal with unissued Shares up to a maximum of 20 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there was a total of 2,210,200,440 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Issue Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to issue up to a maximum of 442,040,088 Shares.

In addition, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM adding any Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate to the Issue Mandate. This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide certain information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange on which securities of the company are listed and such stock exchange as recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong and the Stock Exchange, subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchases of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there was a total of 2,210,200,440 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase up to a maximum of 221,020,044 Shares, being 10 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution for granting the Repurchase Mandate.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general mandate from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's Memorandum and Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands, including (without limitation) the available cash flow or working capital of the Company. There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 31 December 2016) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse impact on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels of the Company.

6. UNDERTAKING

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of knowledge and belief of the Company, the Controlling Shareholders were interested in 1,372,516,820 Shares representing approximately 62.10 per cent of the total issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares, which is proposed to be granted to the Directors pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the shareholding of the Controlling Shareholders would be increased to approximately 69.00 per cent of the total issued share capital of the Company. For the year ended 31 December 2016, the remuneration of Mr. Wang Kunpeng were RMB1,022,000 in total, the details of which are set out in note 8 to the financial statements on page 85 of the Company's 2016 Annual Report.

Mr. Wang Kunpeng does not have any relationships with any directors, senior management or substantial or Controlling Shareholders of the Company nor does he hold any other positions in the Group. He does not at present, nor did he in the last three years, hold any directorships in other public companies, the securities of which are listed in Hong Kong or overseas.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wang Kunpeng was taken to be beneficially interested in 1,230,000 underlying shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO in respect of share options granted to him under the Pre-IPO Share Option Scheme.

2. MR. KOH TEE CHOONG, IVAN – Executive Director

Mr. Koh Tee Choong, Ivan (許智俊先生), aged 58, a master's degree holder in business management from Durham University in the United Kingdom. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Koh did not have any interests in the shares or underlying shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

3. MR. WAN TO – Executive Director

Mr. Wan To (尹濤先生), aged 45, a master's degree holder in business management from University of Leeds in the United Kingdom. He was appointed as an executive Director of the Company on 16 November 2015. Mr. Wan joined the Group in January 2008 and was the assistance of chief executive officer and general management of the network development department of the Company. He has been the vice president of the Company since April 2013 and is currently responsible for the management of investment and development of the Company. From December 2013, he concurrently acted as executive director of Shenzhen SCAS Investment Group Co., Ltd., a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company. Before joining the Group, Mr. Wan was the sales and development manager of BMW Brilliance Automotive Ltd. from November 2003 to November 2006. 4. MR. SHAO YONG JUN – Executive Director
